

TOP TEN TIPS FOR OLDER ADULTS TO STAGE THEIR HOME

- 1. Clear the Clutter This is key! Pack up what you want to keep into boxes and store neatly in the garage or offsite storage. Don't pack up things that are not coming with you to the new home.
- 2. Eliminate personal items You will want your home to be less personal, so for example, pack away personal photographs and knickknacks.
- 3. Tidy closets and cupboard You want to show available storage space so be sure it is all neat and tidy. If necessary pack items up and store if you are keeping items.
- 4. Lighten up the home The home should be as bright and light as possible. Open up the drapes or take them down if they look too heavy. Increase the wattage in light bulbs, maybe bring in some extra lighting. Turn all lamps on before a showing.
